As the need to respond to Covid eases, the MOH will be able to turn their attention to the report. In anticipation of this happening soon, they have asked us to perform a high-level environmental scan to see what the current practices are there regarding PP compensation. We provided an updated addendum to the report with current practices re: patient compensation at the end of March. Will follow up with updates as they are evolve PP recruitment In the process of recruiting 3 Indigenous PPs, 2 PPs from VCH, 1 PP from either North/Island/Interior Will replace David in the coming months Questions/Comments about Updates: Accessibility – language level we put forward needs to be accessible We have a lot of inactive PPs – what are we doing to activate people and making them feel more connected. Perhaps we want to have a conversation about this in a coming meeting. Only 41% of 1200 PPs are active as of March 31, 2020 Note: measuring network members is a false sense of success. We are limited by the number of opportunities that come in every year. We have to look at the alignment with PVN goals and metrics as our measures of success. Another topic for future discussion.
